SIZE


Singapore spans 50 km from East to West and 27 km from North to South, and has over 140 conveniently located train stations island-wide.








ELIGIBILITY

- Be nominated as a Non-Graduating Exchange student from an NUS exchange partner university: nus.edu/3iHkFHM
- Have at least a "B" average, with no grade lower than a "C"
- Complete at least a year of undergraduate study at your home university
- Be proficient in English



PREPARING YOUR APPLICATION

- Courses are typically worth 4 units each, which equates to about 10 hours of preparation and class work each week. As enrolment into specific courses is not guaranteed, we strongly recommend that you select up to 40 units worth of courses in your application, and be flexible in your study plan.
- You must be accepted in at least 12 units worth of courses before you will receive an offer of admission.
- You are allowed to read a maximum of 20 units worth of courses per semester.
- Select the correct level of courses:



1000-3000: Undergraduate courses

4000: Honours courses

5000-6000: Not open to exchange students

VISA

- Courses in Architecture, Civil Engineering, Communications and New Media, Computer Science, Economics, and Mathematics are in high demand and places are limited.
- Ensure that you meet the course prerequisites, if any. For courses that have prerequisites, please provide the syllabi of the courses that you have completed or are currently taking. If you intend to take design-related courses, you must upload a letter from your home university, specifying the year of design courses you should be enrolled in during your exchange.
- You can make modifications to your Study Plan after accepting your offer, during Course Registration (CourseReg). Please ensure that you have sought your university's approval before making any changes to your Study Plan.
- You are advised to complete all necessary exams at your home university before coming to NUS.
- Key application information and links may be found at the end of this brochure.

STUDENT VISA

You will need to obtain a student visa (referred to as Student's Pass) to study at NUS. The Office of the University Registrar will email you the Student's Pass application instructions at least one month before the start of the semester. You will collect your Student's Pass after you arrive in Singapore, but you will need to complete a few steps online prior to your arrival.

If your Student's Pass application is approved, the Singapore Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA) will issue you an In-Principle Approval (IPA) letter. If you require a visa to enter Singapore, you can print the IPA letter and use it as a single-trip entry visa. Otherwise, you may enter Singapore as a tourist.

An Offsite Enrolment (OSE) exercise will be held on campus for you to complete the enrolment for your Student's Pass (during Registration). If you are unable to attend the OSE, you will be asked to make an appointment directly with ICA.





ON-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION

As on-campus accommodation is limited and not guaranteed, do consider off-campus accommodation options concurrently. If you would like to apply for on-campus accommodation, please indicate this on your exchange application to receive application instructions with your admissions offer.

EXCHANGE IN A CRAZY RICH ASIAN CITY?



Although Singapore is touted as one of the most expensive cities in the world, living in Singapore can be affordable and comfortable. Here's a breakdown of expected monthly expenses (in Singapore dollars):

MONTHLY EXPENSES	ON-C AMPUS	OFF-C AMPUS

These figures are a guide—your actual expenses will vary depending on your lifestyle. As on-campus accommodation at NUS is not guaranteed, you should plan for the possibility that you may reside off-campus during your time here. As an exchange student on a Student's Pass, please note that you are not allowed to work or intern in Singapore.

HEALTH AND WELLINESS

As an international student, you must enrol in the NUS Health and Insurance Scheme, which is compulsory and included in the Miscellaneous Student Fees.
